New Website Bolsters Statewide Advocacy Efforts

SAN FRANCISCO, CA – Asian Americans for Civil Rights and Equality (AACRE) announced the launch of their new website today, designed to connect community activists to advocacy efforts at the state capitol. AACRE is California’s first and only Sacramento-based Asian and Pacific Islander American (APIA) legislative and budget advocacy project

AACRE Online, www.aacre.org, has been dramatically reorganized and expanded for activists from all over California to have access to information on state legislation, advocacy resources, and opportunities to connect with each other.

The revamped site provides visitors with toolkits for effective advocacy and up-to-date information on bills and budget proposals that impact APIA communities. Anyone can download these resources, and visitors are encouraged to sign up for the “A-List” – an online network which connects individuals and organizations from across the state who are working on progressive causes.

Features from the original website, such as AACRE’s Report Card, which grades lawmakers on their voting records, are still available.

AACRE’s website developers are calling it a “one-stop-shop for organizations interested in legislative advocacy, but who need the resources to learn how. AACRE Online utilizes internet tools to link activists from all over the state and collectively advance APIA civil rights.”

AACRE is a collaborative project of CAA | Chinese for Affirmative Action, the Asian Pacific American Legal Center, and the Asian Law Caucus. Building on the expertise and commitment of these three civil rights organizations, AACRE focuses its advocacy efforts on assisting low-income, immigrant, and underserved Asian and Pacific Islander Americans.
